SINCE OUR LAST AGM

Waka ama and paddle board activities have become a firm favourite with some hard core participants inspiring the more faint hearted of us to get out there with them.

I take the opportunity in this report to reiterate my thanks to our staff; to Suzanne who does an amazing job maintaining oversight of our activities; Justine who greets you on entering the Rünaka Office with a warm kia ora; Jo Silich, our highly focused accounts administrator, Aroha, who is busy with organizing and servicing hui plus the well patronized tamariki programme; Brendan and George who bring a large kete of skills to the work they do.

Accounts Receivable are valued at estimated realisable value after due allowance for amounts which are not considered recoverable.

525 Blenheim Road Limited

Subsidiary company Puketeraki Limited has a 5.5% interest in this company. The interest is recorded at the Directors' opinion of fair value. Movements in fair value are reflected in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Kai Tahu Ki Otago Limited

The Society has a 25% interest in this company. The investment is accounted for using the equity method.

Managed Investments

These investments are managed by Polson Higgs Wealth Managment Ltd. Investments in this category that comprise equity investments are recorded at market value with unrealised gains and losses reflected in the Statement of Financial Performance. Other investments in this category are recorded at cost (less impairment adjustments if relevant).

Funding Received in Advance

Funding received for which funding conditions have yet to be met or the related expenditure yet to be incurred is recognised in the Statement of Financial Position as Funding Received in Advance until the funding conditions have been meet or related expenditure incurred.

Impairment Adjustments

If in the Executive Committee's opinion the estimated recoverable amount of an investment is less than its carrying amount, the investment is written down to its recoverable amount, and an impairment adjustment is recognised in the statement of financial performance

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies and they have been applied on a basis consistent with the prior year.



1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Reporting

Kati Huirapa Runaka ki Puketeraki is a society incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908, and is registered with the Charities Commission.

These financial statements are general purpose financial reports which have been prepared recognising the framework for differential reporting issued by the New Zealand Institute of Chartered Accountants. In the opinion of the Komiti, the Runaka qualifies for differential reporting as it has no public accountability and is not considered large within the terms of reference in paragraph 4.23 of the framework for differential reporting.

The Komiti has taken advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions except for FRS 19 as GST exclusive financial statements have been prepared.

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost with the exception of certain investments as detailed below.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparing the Consolidated Financial Statements

Subsidiaries

Subsidiaries are those entities controlled, directly or indirectly, by the Incorporated Society. The financial statements of the subsidiaries are included in these financial statements using the purchase method of consolidation. This is applicable to the Incorporation's 100% equity investment in Puketeraki Limited.

Intra group transactions are eliminated in preparing the consolidated financial statements.

Goods and Services Tax

The Statement of Financial Performance has been prepared so that all components are stated exclusive of GST. All items in the Statement of Financial Position are stated net of GST, with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST. However Puketeraki Limited is not registered for GST

Livestock

Livestock inventory is valued at cost.

Income Tax

Kati Huirapa Runaka ki Pukteraki Incorporated is registered with the Charities Commission and therefore is exempt from tax.

Püketeraki Limited - Investment Portfolio Commentary to 30 June 2013¹

We report to you on the investments we have managed for you over the past year.

In the year to 30 June 2013 your PHWM portfolio was up by \$70,462 (or 17%) to \$475,666. This strong performance was on the back of a poor year to June 2012 so it was pleasing to see markets rebound so strongly following the turmoil during the European debt crisis. Over the course of the year the media tended to change its focus from the lingering European debt crisis back toward the United States where the expectation is that the federal government will start to reduce its quantitative easing programme as their economy continues to improve.

Although we know that Europe is not out of the woods yet and America is dominating the headlines we also know that share markets are always looking forward and reacting to any new news that may impact share prices. We expect share markets to remain volatile as this is what they are designed to do. What we also know is that your investment portfolio is beautifully diversified so that you aren't overweighted to any particular country, sector, industry or company. You have eliminated the risk of the failure of a single investment or single country causing catastrophic damage to your portfolio.

As some sectors had grown faster than others over the year we rebalanced your portfolio in May 2013. This is a process whereby we sell some of the securities that have done well (taking profits) and use these funds to top up the securities that have underperformed. This keeps your portfolio in its agreed investment mix and prevents your portfolio from becoming overweighted to a particular sector.

At the same time as we rebalanced your portfolio we used this opportunity to further increase the diversification of our clients' portfolios by introducing the following securities:

International Equities	DFA Global Core Equity – increased from10% to 50% hedging

You manage the majority of your fixed interest securities at the bank. This has resulted in an overweight to NZ fixed interest at the expense of international fixed interest. As your overall mix is 60% growth/40% defensive we took the opportunity to rebalance the portfolio by selling growth securities (shares) to purchase international fixed interest (DFA Five Year Fixed Interest and the Global Bond Trust).

COMMENT FROM THE CHAIRPERSON

ANNUAL INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE COMMENTARY

The Company is pleased to report that the value of the Company's assets to the year to 30 June 2013 increased by 13% to \$723,283. This is pleasing considering the 4% decline in valuation at the same period last year. Making up the increased valuation was the investment portfolio managed by PHWM which was up by \$64,463 (or 16%) to \$475,666. The details of the portfolio managed by PHWM are given in the accompanying material.

The Company has maintained its portfolio mix of 40% "defensive" (funds that are relatively "low" risk such as property, government or company bonds and bank deposits) and 60% "growth" (sharemarket investments). The portfolio investments performed as follows:

As can be seen, the best performing asset was NZ shares with the worst being international and NZ fixed interest.

The investment in 525 Blenheim Road Limited yielded a consistent dividend receipt during the year of \$1,200 per share which amounted to \$6,000.

The Company holds shares in Kiwi Haka Limited which were assigned to the Company by the Incorporated Society. It is pleasing to note that post balance date Kiwi Haka Limited declared and paid a maiden dividend, of \$100 per share which amounted to \$500.

Governance

The Company held five meetings over the last financial year with one special meeting. Meeting attendance was as follows:

Ruckstuhl – 5/5	Ferrall-Heath -2/5	Wyeth – 1/1
Flack - 5/5	Griffiths – 4/5	

During the year, the Company reviewed all its key policies and guidelines at the special meeting. These documents are reviewed periodically, with the Statement of Investment Policies and Objectives and the Strategic Plan reviewed annually. These policies and guidelines guide the Directors' investment and operational procedures.

While there were no major changes in investment policy, the Company has been seeking from the Shareholder (the Incorporated Society) clearer guidelines as to their expectations of the Company. This will help to clarify such things as reporting, information flows and other issues.

The Company has also discussed the extent to which the Shareholder has a requirement for a direct annual return. The Shareholder has informed the Company that it does not require a cash repayment or dividend for the 2013 financial year. This discussion is ongoing.

Finally, the Company wishes to acknowledge the commitment of two directors who are stepping down. Shelley Griffiths has been our independent director since the inception of the Company. Her knowledge of Company Law as well as her Board experience has been invaluable to the Company. Brendan Flack has been a Director since 2008 and his broad understanding of the runaka has been appreciated. On the behalf of the Company, I would like to thank both of them.

With the resignation of Shelly and Brendan, the Company is now seeking an independent Director and another runaka Director. The process for this is undertaken by the Shareholder in line with its regulations.

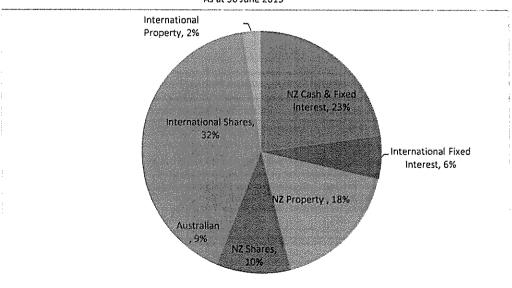

NOTE 1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Reporting Entity

If in the Directors opinion the estimated recoverable amount of an investment is less than its carrying amount, the investment is written down to its recoverable amount, and an impairment adjustment is recognised in the statement of Financial Performance

Investment in 525 Blenheim Road Limited

Puketeraki Limited has a 5.5% interest in this company.

The investment in 525 Blenheim Road Limited is recorded at the Directors' opinion of fair value. Movements in fair value are reflected in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Taxation

Puketeraki Limited is registered with the Charities Commission and is therefore exempt from income tax.

Differential Reporting

The company is an entity qualifying for differential reporting exemptions as it has no public accountability and no separation of ownership and the governing body. All available differential reporting exemptions allowed under the framework for differential reporting have been adopted.
