Te Kete o Aoraki Report

In Term One 2006, 87 schools from Palmerston to Waihola took part in a Maori Student Achievement project – many thanks to all those principals for their participation.

I received data on individual Maori students from within the rohe of Otakou and Puketeraki, from new entrants to Year 10 [Form 4].

- 1 1358 Maori students in total; 680 males [50%] and 678 females [50%]
- 2 Of those 391 were Ngai Tahu [29%] 526 were other iwi [39%] 441 iwi unknown [32%]

This is of concern and will be followed up with principals.

For Numeracy (Maths) the results were very encouraging.

Students with advanced achievement = 237 [17%] Students at / about their correct level = 837 [62%] 79% doing okay or better!

Students whose achievement is at risk= 259 [19%] This is the same or better than non-Maori students in the same area.

4 For Reading Comprehension (understanding what is read) the results are very good.

Students with advanced achievement = 307 [23%] Students at / about their correct level = 732 [53%] 76% doing okay or better!

Students whose achievement is at risk= 296 [22%] This is the same or better than non-Maori students in the same area.

Later I will report more fully on different patterns that came out of the data.

Manager's korero

Back in February I didn't expect to be writing in October as the Runaka Manager but I really enjoyed my time in the Transition Manager role & so have accepted an offer from the executive to provide management services to the runaka for a further 12 month period. Special thanks to the core runaka staff of Sue, Brendon & Bruce, for making my initial role so easy by providing great support and being so proficient at their jobs.

Kia ora to runaka members who live away from our papa kaika, especially those who have been in touch over the past few months with news, comments about what's happening with their whanau and giving us their views on runaka & marae events. It's always really great to get your letters, phone calls and emails.

Life around the marae and runaka office seems to get busier every day. We've had Phys. Ed students from Otago University using the Old School site as a day base for some of their Outdoor Education sessions and in September and October we hosted a number of large hui at the marae. The most exciting activity has been around carving project for the marae mahau. Aroha led a very energetic team of Sharon Parata, Keiran Kent & Cruz Seddon, who striped out the bunk room at the Old School site so it could become the carving room. We managed to give away to good homes most of the wood and particle board from the bunk room. And now we have the James & his carvers on site and the work is underway, ka pai tēnā.

Anyone who has recently parked on the playground area at the Old School will have carefully navigated large chunks of concrete that were breaking up and creating a hazard to vehicles. This week, with lots of support from Community Workers (periodic detention) 3 truck loads of gravel has been spread over the worst parts so you can now manoeuvre without potential damage to your car's sump.

November will be quite busy for us all with the Runaka AGM, general meeting and Marae Trustees meeting on 5th November followed by the Hui a Tau being hosted by Moeraki at the end of the month. Close on the heels of the Hui a Tau is our special day on the 3rd December to honour War Veterans of this area. This will also be the time for our hapū to come together prior to Xmas.

I look forward to seeing our kaumatua and tamariki there enjoying the special events and I especially look forward to working alongside everyone else who can make it.

Veterans Recognition Project – 2006

We are fortunate that many in our country have never known the horror of war. Those who set out to serve New Zealand in times of conflict were also perhaps unaware of the true nature of the challenges that lay ahead. However, their courage and determination in the face of these challenges remains an inspiration to all.

The emphasis of the Year of the Veteran is on communities and their veterans. Community initiatives will be supported by government through the Community Grants Fund. The Year of the Veteran is the time for all communities to stand up and say 'thank you' to veterans.

To that end, the government has established a one million dollar contestable Community Grants Fund. The government will also present a special Year of the Veteran Certificate of Appreciation and Lapel Badge, as an expression of appreciation to those who have served New Zealand in a recognised war or emergency. Every veteran of a recognised war or emergency is eligible for this recognition of New Zealand's enduring appreciation and gratitude for their service.
