Message from Runaka Manager Suzanne Ellison



Tēnā koutou te whānau whānui o Kati Huirapa ki Puketeraki.

Kia ora whānau, at the Runaka and Marae we're keeping an eye on the calendar as the nation moves out of Level 2 back to Level 1 on 6th September (all going well). The marae will re-open at Level 1 to external bookings as people attempt to hold hui that have been



postponed, with some groups trying to rebook for a third time. The marae calendar remains very full for the rest of the year and we continue to brace ourselves for further Covid disruption for at least the next 12 -18 months.

Among the changes that have been made is a decision not to run a Tamariki hui during the school holidays this year. We postponed from the July holidays with the idea of trying to proceed in October but we've landed on the side of caution and decided we're not ready to bring together tamariki and whānau from different areas to the marae for 3 days or so. Even in Level 1 conditions the social distancing and other measures to ensure everyone's safety is challenging. We may feel up to the challenge next year or may come up with a way to hold a good hui for tamariki that doesn't expose whānau to undue risks.
