He Pitopito Korero

2008 has been a stressful year on many fronts but especially for our some of our whānau and hapū who are still keenly feeling the loss of loved ones. Our thoughts are with them, especially as we move into the festive season.

It seems that the older you get the faster time passes and this year is positively whizzing past for me. There doesn't seem enough time left in the year to complete all the mahi we planned but we are giving it our best shot.

One of the big projects still to be tackled is the rūnaka process around the appointment of the rūnaka representative and alternate representative to Te Runanga o Ngai Tahu. Ros Wyeth, Katharina Ruckstuhl and Tama Smith were asked at the November Rūnaka General meeting to form a working party for this mahi. They will be in touch with their recommendations prior to the first Rūnaka General meeting of 2009 that is probably being held in March (date yet to be confirmed).

In conjunction with Ngai Tahu commemorations for Waitangi Day that are being hosted by Awarua Rūnanga next year we planning a rūnaka / hapū trip. We will travel on Waitangi Day to Awarua, stay overnight in the Murihiku area & leave the next day to explore the Chaslands, Catlins coast on the return journey. Once funding has been confirmed for this haerenga, the trip details will be finalised and a pānui circulated.

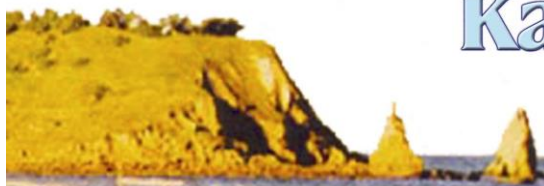
It is great to have whānau initiating and running the wānaka series, Te Whiringa o te Muku Tangata o Puketeraki; a project dedicated to researching, documenting and creatively exploring the whakapapa links between Puketeraki whānau. Watch out for pānui about the wanaka and hikoi that are part of this important kaupapa.

Over Labour weekend the marae was home for a Dunedin based women's waka ama crew who keenly tackled choppy & cold sea conditions to get some open sea training in prior to leaving for the World Champs in the Cook Islands. Despite the inclement weather hardy locals also took the opportunity to have another go at paddling the waka ama and there is now a rumour Karitane may become home port for a waka ama. We've got our fingers crossed about that.

Native bird cards are available for purchase. Proceeds from the sale of these cards contribute to the Ecosanctuary forest restoration programme.

The selection of schools is dependent on which iwi is in residence at the time and is often selected by members of that particular iwi. Ngai Tahu is the current one in residence at Te Papa, with its exhibition “Mo Tatou” showing until mid 2009.

The 21 pupils of Karitane School created their model “Kaitiaki”, showing some of the buildings, history and tradition of Karitane. The project was completed in eight school days spread over three weeks at Puketeraki Marae.

The Karitane School exhibit will be on display at Te Papa, from just before Christmas until August 2009.





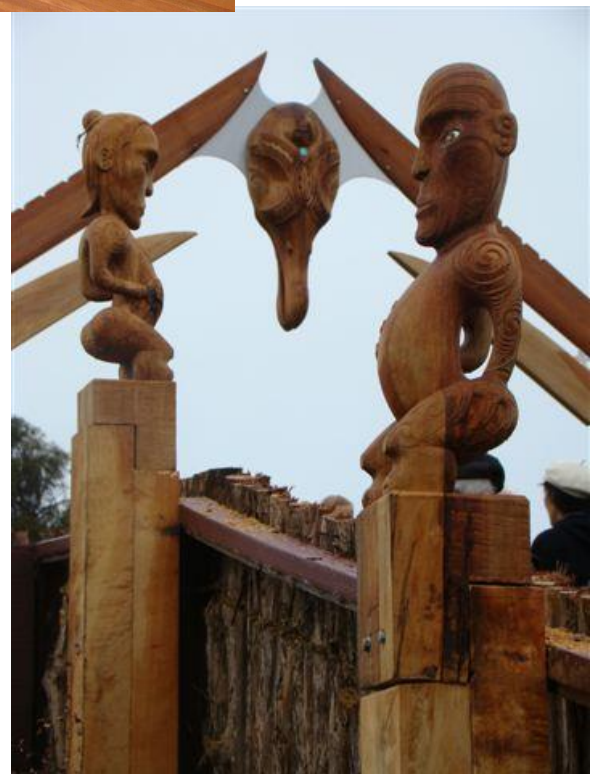

This whakatauki was the inspiration behind the design of the waharoa by Ross Hemera & James York. It talks about the messenger birds, the Kea, the Mapo & the Toroa, linking the inland mountains to the coast making reference to the extent of the rohe of Kati Huirapa. The waharoa welcomes visitors from near & far, manuhiri & tangata whenua. The arms & koruru of the Toroa welcome everyone whilst the 8 waka draw in our whanau as well as linking to other hapu. The messenger birds call out to our whanau to bring them home & welcome them as they arrive.

On the pathway leading up to the waharoa are 4 tekoteko and 2 manaia.

The very beautiful mahau created by Jenny Rendall, Simon Kaan & James York is based on a creation story told by Matiaha Tiramorehu.

We hope to produce a detailed explanation for all the new works in the near future.
